


Step-Up DSHA Delaware's Supportive Housing Program

Overview: Step-Up is a supportive housing program, funded as a pilot in 2007. Eligible participants include:

- 1. Youth exiting the foster care;
- 2. Individuals with mental health and/or substance abuse conditions; and
- 3. Individuals with disabling conditions.



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Step-Up

Delaware's Supportive Housing Program


- Request for Proposals (RFP) process.
- Criteria for selection includes, but is not limited to:
 - 1. Organizational and Financial Capacity
 - 2. Detailed Supportive Service Plan for Residents
 - 3. Availability of units and evidence of housing needs and services
 - 4. Statewide Geographic Distribution
 - Capacity and ability of the organization to meet requirements of the program

Step-Up
Delaware's Supportive Housing Program

Accomplishments -

- 100% achieved stabilized housing;
- 100% have an individualized supportive service plan;
- 100% are enrolled in any supportive services that they are eligible for;
- 100% received mental health and/or substance abuse counseling;
- Over 25% have received their HS diploma or GED; and
- Roughly 65% of all exits from the Step-Up program were the result of other permanent affordable housing options becoming available.



Step-Up

Delaware's Supportive Housing Program

- "If I were not in this program right now, I'd either be homeless or well on my way to being homeless. I wouldn't have my child with me because I would be on the streets and I would probably have quit school. I probably would give up trying to make the perfect life for me and my child."
- "One reason that this program has been successful thus far is due to the flexibility and understanding that in serving this population, challenges arise that require special consideration."

"Every individual story is different on why this person became homeless, however, each person is able to experience a new sense of independence with the Step-Up Voucher."



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State Rental Assistance Program \$3,000,000

- Joint proposal with Department of Health And Social Services (DHSS) and The Department of Services for Children, Youth and their Families (DSCYF-Kids Dept) for \$3 million annually beginning in FY12
- Rental assistance for 350 individuals and families with a need for community-based supportive services
- ✓ Serving Extremely-Low-Income families : 30% AMI (~ \$20k per year for a family of 4)



State Rental Assistance Program - Background

- ✓ Need for **1,000** vouchers
 - ✓ Ten-Year Plan to End Chronic Homelessness and Reduce Long-Term Homelessness (2007)
 - ✓ Housing Delaware's Extremely Low-Income Households (2009)
- √ 450 individuals in five state-run long-term care facilities
- ✓ 190 children will "age out" of foster care within the next two
 years

Funding	Requesting \$3 million from the Governor and General Assembly to create 300-350 housing vouchers in FY2012.	Leverage existing resources (Medicaid, etc.).	
Administration	Housing component (based on experience with Housing Choice Voucher program).	Supportive services component (via case managers).	
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Eligibility criteria

- Household income <30% AMI
- Supportive services history
- Access to supportive services
- Case manager referral
- HCV (Federal Section 8) waiting list

State Rental Assistance Program - Outcomes

- Provide affordable housing with community-based supportive services to program participants
- ✓ Move individuals out of state-run long-term care facilities and into home- and community-based care programs
- ✓ Cost savings/cost avoidance for the state in the long run
 - ✓ Housing subsidy cost of \$7,000 \$9,000 per year
- ✓ In line with Governor's vision and three agency agendas
