Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA) enhances economic and community vitality through housing and historic preservation activities, and provides financial and technical assistance through public and private partnerships to create and preserve safe and decent affordable housing for the people of Michigan.

MSHDA's mission is defined and dedicated to three major goals that call for specific tangible objectives:

Goal #1: Building Financial Solvency to Advance Mission

Goal #2: A Roof for Every Homeless Veteran

Goal #3: Improving the Customer Experience

Advance Agency Mission and Achieve Strategic Objectives

To improve the customer experience, MSHDA's Information Technology staff advanced the agency's capability of reporting program results with a new, sophisticated -- yet user-friendly -- online data portal (i.e., impact dashboard). Previously, data reporting was fairly static and, if available online, limited in its accessibility and usefulness. In coordinating the design, structure, and launch of the new online system, MSHDA IT staff has produced an impressive online tool that reflects industry best practice.

MSHDA's impact dashboard effectively melds big data with the technology and mapping capability of Geographic Information Systems (GIS). The result is a web-based reporting tool that uses geo-spatial technologies to map the distribution of state and federal program dollars flowing through MSHDA. Program information is aggregated at the lowest level allowable without revealing any sensitive information about program participants. The system data is more dynamic with the capability of being updated quarterly. Finally, users of the system have maximum flexibility and may search data by the following categories:

- Entire State (Aggregate)
- State Economic Region
- County
- Municipalities
- U.S. Congressional District
- State Senate District
- State House District

Currently, data is available in the system for the years 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.

Effectively Employing Partnerships Statewide

The Program Impact Data Portal was a joint effort of MSHDA's IT Services, Governmental and Media Affairs, and other key program teams. It also was a cross-agency collaboration with the Michigan Department of Technology, Management and Budget's Center for Shared Solutions (CSS). As such, the effort combined MSHDA's programmatic expertise with CSS's mapping know-how and data management skills. Fundamentally, it was a complex, complicated project that resulted in a highly intuitive, user-friendly tool for customers.

Effective Use of Resources, Innovation, and Replicable

After making the initial investment in staff time to develop, design, and implement the online portal, the long-term maintenance of the system, which is primarily data-driven, will be highly cost-effective. Furthermore, this online tool's value will increase as policymakers, legislators, researchers, program managers, and other stakeholders discover a variety of uses for data that is now at their fingertips.

Generally, replication of this online system is possible, especially as GIS expertise has become more prevalent and accessible for state housing agencies. Furthermore, the GIS community is highly collaborative, which opens the door for state-to-state collaboration. At a minimum, Michigan's online system sets a good example of what is possible and creates opportunity for further advancements in the use of big data with GIS.


