### Prioritizing Housing

- Regional Solutions Interagency collaboration
- Governor Brown asked agency directors to focus on housing and seek joint solutions
- Reviewed agency tools:
  - What is flexible?
  - What is useful?

#### Collect information

- Convened developers and employers to understand the barriers to market rate development between 60% - 120% AMI
- Drafted a multi-agency Request for Information
- Cobbled together resources to start doing something through a Request for Applications
- Engaged with the Governor's Institute for Community Design

### Request for Applications

#### Available resources:


- OHCS \$1.5M, flexible
- Business Oregon \$3M, infrastructure loans
- \$50,000, planning grants

Number of applications: 31

Pilots funded: 5

# City of Donald and GK Machine \$775,000 state investment

- The first phase of the pilot will include upgrading the city's wastewater and water treatment plants to support 95 new homes, with an eventual planned total of 465 new homes
- Contingent upon expansion of the Urban Growth Boundary into prime farmland





# Nestucca Ridge Development \$300,000 state investment

- Pacific City beautiful coastal town dominated by vacation rental
- The developer has 200 employees in this town, with half commuting outside the county
- 12 homes on several acres they currently own, pre-leasing 6 units to their local employees

# Jefferson Co School District & Warm Springs Reservation \$240,000 state investment

- School District currently owns 8 small homes built in the 1950s
- The pilot project will rehabilitate existing properties and purchase 2 new manufactured homes for local elementary and middle school teachers at the Warm Springs K-8 Academy



## Proud Ground \$515,000 state investment


- Proud Ground uses a land trust model to combine a subsidy to lower the purchase price of homes on the open market with land lease and affordability covenants.
- The County and 2 major cities invested matching funds as well as partnering with the local school district and other employers
- The pilot will fund 8 homebuyers

### **Harney County** \$35,000 state investment

Housing Needs Analysis to:

inventory existing housing, identify gaps, and create a strategic implementation and business plan to leverage investments, engage employers and create job opportunities.





#### Current Status

- Executed Grant agreements in 3 of 5 Pilot Communities
- General terms of grants are 3 years, with quarterly and annual reports
- After 3 years projects must remain owned and operated as agreed upon for 10 years; any changes must be approved by OHCS



### Next Steps

- Governor Brown's Housing Agenda
  - \$370M Total
  - Greater Oregon Housing Accelerator:
    - \$20M Loan Guarantee
    - \$15M Flexible
- Strong relationship with League of Cities and Association of Counties
- Agency Alignment
