- 15% set-aside
- Community Need

- \$250,000/yr- County
- \$300,000/yr- Housing authority



New Path Community Housing

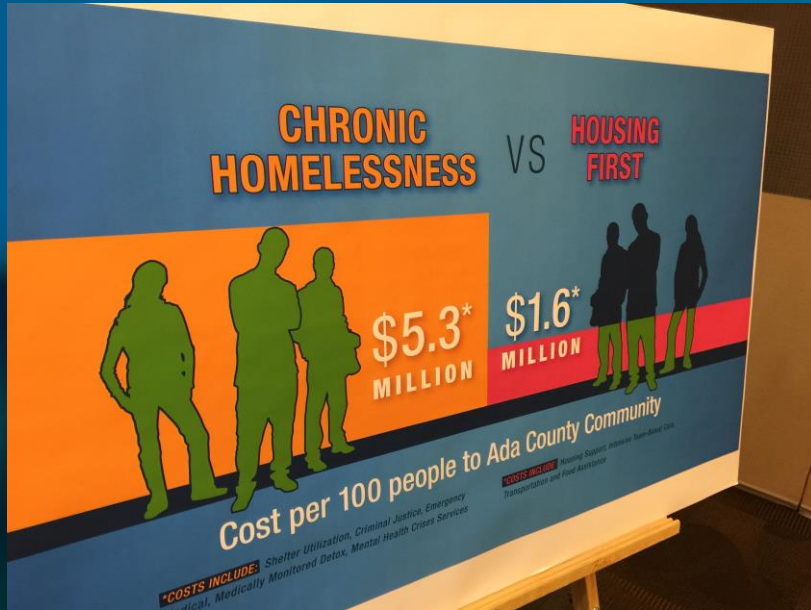
- 40 units for the CH
