OVERVIEW

Marsh Brook Place provides permanent supportive housing for transition-aged youth (ages 18–24) who are impacted by homelessness, have recently aged out of foster care into unstable housing, are experiencing mental health conditions and substance use disorders, or have been victims of domestic violence or human trafficking.



Community Housing Network developed and manages the property. The Huckleberry House provides on-site supportive services using evidence-based approaches such as blended management, trauma-informed care, harm reduction strategies, and critical time intervention principles. Residents have the opportunity to learn basic living skills, overcome developmental delays, and address limited employment and education experience. Marsh Brook Place is part of the
